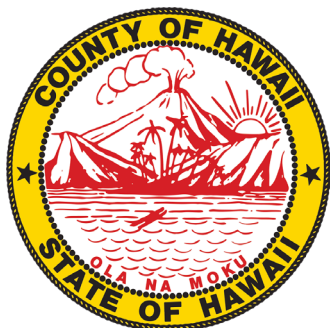
Priorities
